Horse Sports are a Dangerous Activity - DANGEROUS ACTIVITY ACKNOWLEDGEMENT & WAIVER

In consideration for being permitted to participate in any way in horse sport activities and in particular this event, I understand, acknowledge and accept that:

1. This waiver governs my participation in any and all activities offered or organised, in whole or in part, by or in conjunction with the Association ("Relevant Activities");
2. There are many real and potential risks and hazards associated with activities involving horses and endurance riding;
3. Horses are powerful animals of individual free will and are potentially dangerous;
4. I am responsible for assessing and managing all inherent risks that may arise - including but not limited to the terrain, on public roadways, from the weather or other forces - during my participation in Relevant Activities, and understand that such risks may vary from ride to ride;
5. I am responsible for the welfare, control and behaviour of any horse in my care or which I elect to ride, and for ensuring that I am capable of managing any such horse in relation to the safety and welfare of myself, other participants or the general public, and in regard to property;
6. I will comply with the AERARulebook as instructed by Ride Organisers and Ride Officials;
7. It is compulsory to wear an approved safety helmet at all times when on a horse at any event affiliated with the Association;
8. I am free to withdraw my participation from an affiliated event at any time, subject to compliance with the AERA Rulebook;
9. I will comply with any reasonable request or instruction issued by a ride organiser or official of the Association, and agree that if my participation in an event is terminated due to non-compliance that I will waive any claim or refund;
10. I owe a duty of care for the safety of myself and others, and if I have a medical condition or an impairment which may affect my capacity to act safely and in the best interests of the welfare of myself, other participants, the general public, or any horse, or any property, then I will not participate in the Relevant Activities and will take full responsibility for any consequence of such medical condition or impairment;
11. I agree not to consume alcohol in an amount which causes my blood alcohol content to exceed the applicable legal limits whilst participating in the Relevant Activities. I understand and agree that I will be responsible for any loss, damage, cost, claim or expense arising from any injury, loss or damage caused or contributed to by my consumption of alcohol up to the applicable legal limit whilst participating in the Relevant Activities, and that I will not be covered by insurance in that event;
12. I agree not to consume any mind-altering drug or any other substance that may be prohibited by law before or during the Relevant Activities. I understand and agree that I will be responsible for any loss, damage, cost, claim or expense arising from any injury, loss or damage caused or contributed to by my consumption of such substances whilst participating in the Relevant Activities, and that I will not be covered by insurance in that event;
13. If there is an outbreak of a notifiable equine disease, such as Hendra Virus or Equine Influenza, then relevant government t department(s) may prevent or restrict the movement of horses, vehicles and personnel for a period of time, and that any costs or expenses borne by any person or organisation for and on behalf of my horse(s) or myself shall be my responsibility.

I have had sufficient opportunity to read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that I have given up substantial rights by signing it, and sign it freely and voluntarily without inducement of any kind.

I, declare that the horse named above has been in good health, eating normally and not shown signs of illness during the last 7 days leading up to this event. I give my authorisation for the Event Organising Committee/Manager to call for veterinary inspection of the horse named above and in my care should they be showing signs of illness at any time during the course of the event. I agree to pay any veterinary fees incurred for the above mentioned horses as a result of this veterinary examination.

I AGREE THAT:

1. The horse will be shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and its hooves will be picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo.
2. All vehicles and equipment accompanying the horse will be cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected.

I FURTHER DECLARE THAT:

3. The information contained in this Biosecurity Declaration is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.
4. I agree to abide by all conditions that may be imposed at any time by the Event Organising Committee/Manager.
5. I acknowledge that if I fail to comply, I may be directed to leave and my nominations will be forfeited.
6. I acknowledge that decontamination and disinfection procedures may be required of me if instructed by the Event Organising Committee/Manager.
7. I acknowledge that there is a possibility that horses might become infected with disease agents as a result of any movements and if necessary horses and premises will be quarantined in accordance with any Legislation covering such occurrences including policies and procedures in effect at that time. I agree and acknowledge that the Manager/Event Organising Committee, it's State or National Affiliated bodies and their members are not in any way liable for any cost, expense, loss, damage, claim, action, proceeding or other liability incurred by or made against me as a result of any movement of horses to the Event/Farm.

How do I take a horse's temperature?

The best way to take the horse's temperature is rectally. Keep a plastic digital thermometer in your medical kit. They are safe, easy to use, inexpensive and available at most pharmacies and are operated by pressing a button to turn them on. Simply lubricate with petroleum jelly (Vaseline) and insert the thermometer into the horse's rectum. Always clean the thermometer well before returning it to its case...and especially if used on an ill horse, to prevent the spreading of an illness. It may take one to three minutes for an accurate reading, although many digital thermometers take readings quickly and beep when they are done. Simply read the digital display for the horse's temperature. (Note: So you don't lose the thermometer in your horse, attach a piece of string to the handle end along with an alligator clip. When the thermometer is inserted, fasten the alligator clip to tail hairs, thus securing it!)

Normal body temperature is 37.5 – 38.5° C, but environmental factors can affect the readings by 0.5-1° C. Horses tend to have higher temperatures in warm weather. Exercise, stress or excitement will raise temperature as well. This is why it's important to take your horse's temperature many times and in many different situations so you will know what the norm is. Respiratory colds and infected cuts usually generate temperatures in the 39-40°C range. Viral infections cause either early subnormal temperatures (similar to chills one feels with a viral cold) or very elevated temperatures, 41-42°C. Occasionally, infections will cause biphasic fevers that show a normal temperature in the morning, but will spike a high temperature in the afternoon. When you are concerned about possible illness, record the horse's temperature twice a day and look for patterns and changes.

What is required?

All horses (including companion and alternate horses) which you intend bringing to the event must have their rectal temperature taken once daily and recorded in the temperature log table above. You must begin taking and recording the temperature from three days prior and continue each day until your horse(s) enters the ride base at which time you must provide this document to the Camp allocation officer/official who will retain it.

What should I do if my horse's temperature exceeds 38.5C before I leave home?

You should immediately contact your local veterinarian and heed your local veterinarian's advice whether to travel your horse. If you do travel your horse, a veterinary examination report stating the reason for the increased temperature must accompany this document and be provided to the camp allocation officer/official on arrival of the horse at the ride base.
